From salt and sugar to the chicest mints, this month's beauty offerings get fresh.

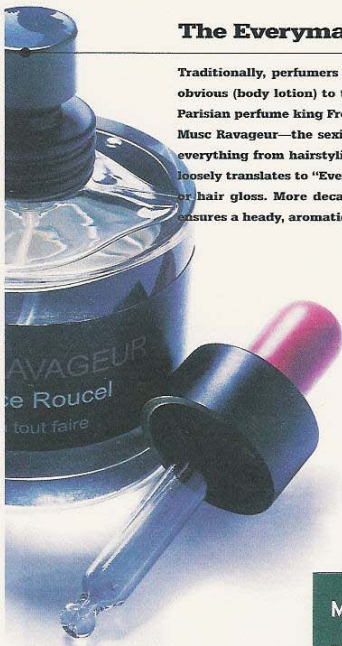
Gently Does It

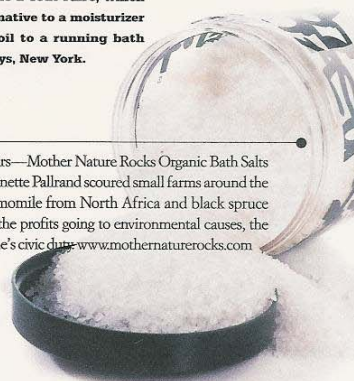
The Everyman
