



Breath Poll Mirrors Political Polls

NEW YORK (Wireless Flash) -- Americans are just as undecided about whether John Kerry or George W. Bush has better breath as they are over which one they want to be their next president.

A breath mint manufacturer has started a poll at momints.com asking folks to name the candidate that they think has the better breath and, so far, the results are neck-and-neck with both candidates receiving around 50 percent of the vote.

Yosha! Enterprises spokesman Anthony Shurman admits people are probably voting for the candidate they are aligned with, and, consequently, the breath poll is mirroring many political polls.
